
Comments from last year's retreat included:

### Listening and Spoken Language...

#### An Option for Deaf Children

The first thought most parents have when their child is diagnosed with a hearing loss is that they will need to learn sign language. However, there are other options. Today, children identified with hearing loss can learn to listen and develop spoken language.

The diagnosis, treatment, and outcomes of childhood hearing loss have changed dramatically in recent years. With the help of hearing aids and cochlear implants, many children who are diagnosed early and treated appropriately can develop speech and language in step with their hearing peers.

The goal of auditory-oral education is to help children develop spoken language and academic skills in order to be successful in a regular classroom environment and to work and live in a predominately hearing society. To meet that goal, children are often educated, at least for a time, in an intensive language-rich auditory-oral environment with other students that have hearing loss.

Oral deaf education is a collaborative, family centered approach that builds a child's confidence and life skills along with listening and spoken language. It combines today's sophisticated hearing technologies with intensive early intervention to teach children to listen and talk.
